RE News

In recent weeks, the church celebrated the Ascension of the Lord, and will celebrate Pentecost Sunday and Trinity Sunday over the coming weeks. As Catholics it is essential to reflect upon and celebrate the profound significance of these moments in our faith journey. The Ascension of Jesus, the outpouring of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, and the revelation of the Holy Trinity on Trinity Sunday hold great importance and offer us valuable lessons as we deepen our relationship with God.

The Ascension of Jesus

The Ascension marks the culmination of Jesus' earthly ministry and signifies His return to the Father in heaven. Forty days after His Resurrection, Jesus, in the presence of His disciples, ascended into heaven. This event holds immense meaning for us as believers. It reminds us of Christ's victory over death and His exaltation as the King of all creation. Moreover, the Ascension assures us of our own hope for eternal life with God.

The Ascension also serves as a call to action. Before ascending, Jesus commissioned His disciples to go forth and spread the Good News to all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. It is a reminder of our duty as Catholics to be witnesses of Christ's love, mercy, and teachings, sharing His message with others through our words and actions.

The Feast of Pentecost

Pentecost, often referred to as the "birthday of the Church," commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the apostles and disciples of Jesus. This event took place fifty days after Easter and transformed the early Christian community. The Holy Spirit empowered them to boldly proclaim the Gospel, inspiring unity and diversity among believers from different nations and languages.

The outpouring of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost remains relevant for us today. The Spirit's gifts, such as wisdom, knowledge, understanding, fortitude, and fear of the Lord, continue to guide and empower us as we navigate our Christian lives. The Holy Spirit is the advocate and helper Jesus promised, strengthening us to face the challenges of our time and enabling us to live out our faith authentically.

Pentecost is a reminder of the Church's mission to be a beacon of God's love, mercy, and salvation. Just as the disciples were sent forth to share the Good News, we are called to proclaim the Gospel in our families, workplaces, communities, and beyond. Pentecost invites us to be open to the Holy Spirit's promptings, so that we may be effective witnesses of Christ's transformative power in the world.

Trinity Sunday

On Trinity Sunday, we celebrate the mystery of the Holy Trinity—the belief in one God who exists as three persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. While the concept of the Trinity may seem complex, it is at the core of our Catholic faith. The Trinity reveals the nature of God as a loving community of persons, an eternal exchange of self-giving love.

The Trinity teaches us the importance of unity, diversity, and relationship. It invites us to reflect on the unity and diversity within the Church and to embrace the richness that comes from different cultures, backgrounds, and spiritual gifts. It reminds us that just as the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are in perfect relationship, we are called to foster loving relationships with one another.

Trinity Sunday encourages us to ponder the mystery of God's love and deepen our understanding of the divine. It invites us to contemplate the profound reality that God is present in our lives, guiding us, and sustaining us through His grace. It also reminds us of our call to participate in the divine life through prayer, worship, and acts of charity.

As we reflect on the celebrations of Ascension, Pentecost, and Trinity Sunday, let us open our hearts to the lessons these occasions offer. May we be inspired by the Ascension to be faithful witnesses, empowered by the Holy Spirit at Pentecost to share the Gospel boldly, and enlightened by the mystery of the Trinity to deepen our love for God and one another.

P&F Update

An Executive Meeting of the P & F meeting was held on 8th May. During this meeting Acting Principal Katrina Miller advised the committee about changes to the new Australian Curriculum. The teaching staff had an Inservice from a curriculum advisor informing them about the new changes in which the curriculum is to be delivered. With these new changes there are several resources that need to be purchased such as decodable reading texts for guided reading from Prep to Year 2 to ensure we are delivering learning at the current standard.

It was previously mentioned at assembly that the P & F were going to purchase new fridges and robot vacuums for classrooms. But after further investigations into ongoing costs and maintenance of these items they are no longer going to be purchased and once the current fridges reach their end of life they will not be replaced.

A TV panel is also going to be purchased for the Year 2 classroom (the same as what the P & F had previously funded for the 3/4 classroom and 5/6 classroom in 2023).

In 2024, the key focus of the P & F funds will be:

- 1. To support the teaching staff with resources to deliver the new curriculum changes.
- 2. Putting aside \$15-20K per year to fund a new playground as the current playground will need to be replaced within the next 5 years. Note this has a starting cost upwards of \$80,000 and this money needs to be totally fundraised.
