



Principal's Message

In recent weeks, I have shared the knowledge I gained from reading several texts on human behaviour: "What Happened to You?" by Oprah Winfrey and Dr. Bruce Perry, "Choice Theory: A New Psychology of Personal Freedom" by William Glasser, and "In the Realm of Hungry Ghosts: Close Encounters with Addiction" by Gabor Maté.

As a teacher, I am deeply committed to educating children with the hope of creating a wonderful and joyous future for everyone. I can achieve this by understanding the factors that impact their lives and providing an environment that nurtures their strengths and empowers them to meet their challenges.

I have carefully examined these texts to share their central themes with you and have arrived at the following suggestions. As you read over my suggestions, I invite you to consider why I chose these texts and how their content can guide me in fostering an educational community that honours our three pillars: Knowledge, Love, and Truth.

The themes of "What Happened to You?" by Oprah Winfrey and Dr. Bruce Perry

- **Trauma and Healing**: This book explores how trauma affects the brain and body, emphasising the importance of understanding an individual's history of trauma to foster healing and recovery.
- **Resilience and Recovery**: It discusses the human capacity for resilience and the pathways to recovery through supportive relationships and therapeutic interventions.
- **Empathy and Compassion**: The book promotes a shift in perspective from asking "What's wrong with you?" to "What happened to you?" to foster empathy and compassion in addressing trauma.

The themes of "In the Realm of Hungry Ghosts: Close Encounters with Addiction" by Gabor Maté

- Addiction as a Response to Pain: Maté explores the idea that addiction is not a choice but a response to deep-seated emotional pain and trauma.
- Holistic View of Health: The book advocates for a holistic approach to understanding and treating addiction, considering the physical, emotional, and social aspects of a person's life.
- **Empathy and Compassion**: Maté stresses the need for empathy and compassion in dealing with those suffering from addiction, moving away from judgment and stigma.
- **Impact of Society**: The book examines the role of societal factors, such as stress, isolation, and socioeconomic conditions, in contributing to the prevalence of addiction.

The themes of "Choice Theory: A New Psychology of Personal Freedom" by William Glasser

- **Personal Responsibility**: Glasser's theory emphasizes that individuals have control over their own behaviour and are responsible for the choices they make.
- **Internal Motivation**: The book argues that all human behaviour is driven by internal needs and that understanding these needs can help people make better choices.
- **Healthy Relationships**: Glasser highlights the importance of creating and maintaining fulfilling relationships based on mutual respect and understanding.

• Quality World: The concept of the "Quality World" is central, referring to the mental pictures of what people want in their lives and how these pictures influence their choices and behaviour.

To distil the themes of these powerfully informative texts into a single common thread is almost an injustice to their depth and richness. However, I undertook this task to provide my teaching philosophy with a guiding framework. Summarising these insights into one common theme was challenging, as it required me to confront my biases and resist relying solely on what I already knew. Reading is about expanding knowledge and embracing new, contemporary directions.


A single common thread

These three books have taught me that understanding and addressing the root causes of human behaviour is crucial to fostering healing and personal growth. Each text explores the underlying factors that shape actions and choices—whether it be trauma, internal needs, or addiction—and emphasises the importance of empathy, compassion, and responsibility in the journey toward recovery and personal freedom.

Therefore, our intentions for St. Teresa's are encapsulated in the following beliefs:

"It is easier to build strong children than to repair broken adults."

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

"Chasing the Scream: The First and Last Days of the War on Drugs" by Johann Hari

is a comprehensive examination of the history, impact, and future of drug prohibition. Hari embarks on a three-year journey across nine countries to uncover the truths and myths surrounding the war on drugs, drawing on extensive research and numerous personal stories.

"Chasing the Scream" argues that the war on drugs has been a catastrophic failure and calls for a radical rethinking of how society addresses drug addiction. By combining historical analysis, personal narratives, and scientific research, Hari makes a compelling case for policies that prioritise compassion, treatment, and harm reduction over punishment and prohibition.

Maths: This week we starting learning about place value and tens and ones. We are also reinforcing of numbers, names and numerals 1-30! We are very clever.








