Jesus said to his disciples: "You are the salt of the earth. But what if salt goes flat? How can you restore its flavour? Then it is good for nothing but to be thrown out and trampled underfoot. "You are the light of the world. A city set on a hill cannot be hidden. People do not light a lamp and then put it under a bushel basket. They set it on a stand where it gives light to all in the house. In the same way, your light must shine before men and women so that they may see goodness in your acts and give praise to your heavenly Father."

All: Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

In today's Gospel, Jesus gives us two powerful images to reflect upon: salt and light. Both are ordinary, everyday things, yet they carry extraordinary meaning in the context of our faith.

Jesus tells us, "You are the salt of the earth." Salt is essential; it preserves, it heals, and it brings out the best in food. But when salt loses its flavour, it becomes useless, good for nothing but to be thrown out. Jesus is reminding us that our faith, like salt, must be vibrant and alive. If our faith becomes stagnant or routine, it loses its essence and its ability to influence and preserve the goodness in the world. We are called to be the salt that brings out the best in others, and that preserves the values of love, justice, and mercy in our communities.


Jesus also says, "You are the light of the world." Light is something we often take for granted, but in the darkness, it becomes our guide, our hope. A city on a hill cannot be hidden, and neither should the light of our faith. Jesus calls us to let our light shine, not for our own glory, but so that others may see the goodness in our deeds and give praise to God.

In a world that often feels overwhelming and dark, it's easy to think that our small actions don't matter. But Jesus reminds us that even a single light can illuminate an entire house, and even a small amount of salt can flavour an entire dish. Our lives and our actions, no matter how small, have the power to influence and transform the world around us.

So today, let us renew our commitment to be the salt of the earth and the light of the world. Let us live our faith boldly and authentically so that through our actions, others may come to know the goodness of God. And in doing so, may we bring flavour and light to a world in need.

We couldn't do it without you all!!




