



#### The Principal's Book Pick





Abolition. Feminism. Now. by Angela Y. Davis, Gina Dent, Erica Meiners, and Beth Richie is a compelling manifesto that intertwines the principles of abolition and feminism. The book argues for the dismantling of the prison-industrial complex and the creation of community-based systems of care and support. It highlights the often-overlooked contributions of feminist organising, particularly from queer, anticapitalist, grassroots, and women of colour movements.

The authors provide a historical context, tracing the roots of abolitionist feminism and showcasing its relevance in contemporary social justice movements. They emphasise the importance of intersectionality and internationalism in addressing systemic violence and inequality.

While some readers might find the book's academic tone challenging, its call to action is clear and urgent. It serves as both an introduction to and a deep dive into the necessity of combining abolitionist and feminist practices to create a more just and equitable society.



we have two more waiting on backorder.











